THE VILLAGER COMMUNITY BUS

The popular community bus, launched by Cllr Filmer in 2006, provides a range of transport services from predestined trips to reasonably priced hire opportunities for community groups. It has operated for the last 10 years as a cost-effective and flexible means for groups to travel.



To ensure the service can continue, the Villager services will be run by Medway Norse as of 1st April 2016. Group hire will still be available and there will be no anticipated loss or reduction of any services.



HIGH HALSTOW CROSSING

I promised that I would deliver a pedestrian crossing outside High Halstow Primary School.

This is ready to go and will be built during the Easter holiday

due to local feedback. This crossing will be an important improvement for the hundreds of children and families who cross the road every day.

MEDWAY LOCAL PLAN

The council is producing a new local plan for Medway to manage the area's growth over the next 20 years. Over 200 people responded to the 'Issues and Options' consultation on the first stage of the plan carried out in January and February.

There was support for Medway's regeneration but concern that infrastructure and services could be under pressure with increased housebuilding. Council planners are now considering the responses in drafting up the plan.

The new plan must look at options for development across Medway, which includes land on the Hoo Peninsula. No decisions have yet been made on sites to be allocated for development. As the work on the local plan progresses, further information will be published about potential sites, and people will be asked for their views.
